You may remember a few years ago, I shared a story about a local Tijuana church that had to be relocated. Bringing new meaning to the phrase "church split", there was a large and growing crack in the earth on the side of the hill where the church stood. Indeed the crack did eventually topple the church and a significant section of the neighborhood as well. The pastor of that church is Juan Toscano who is also on our Spectrum staff. Juan grew up around Spectrum. Even now in his fifties, he can vividly describe to you the first Hot Wheels car Pastor Von our founder gave him when he was a little boy!

Our solution when this was happening was to offer his church the use of our building in one of our neighborhoods where Spectrum hosts outreaches. No one really knew how this move was going to affect the church at the time, but it seemed like it was the decision God was leading us to make. In a way that only God could, He affirmed the move by mixing together the compassion ministry Spectrum has faithfully been conducting for so long, with the sharing of the Gospel. One by one, people who we've known for many years in this neighborhood came to a saving faith in Him. I think of Eugenia who brought her kids to

Spectrum events when they were young, being baptized in the church. And now her husband is starting to go as well! Salud, now in her eighties, is there every time the church doors are open. And Vicente, the neighborhood drunk, heard the message of the Gospel and gave his life to Christ at a Spectrum event. As the wear and tear on

his body from the lifestyle he had lived, began to affect his health, he would share the truths he was learning on Sundays with the unsuspecting souls in the hospital waiting room. In 2019 Vicente passed away, but praise God we know where He is today!

As we all know, 2020 brought a whole new set of challenges to churches everywhere. Like many, when COVID hit, Juan was forced to go to online services which he posted live on Facebook. What would this do to his congregation? Would it bring to a halt the progress they were making? Well as the months wore on people not only inside the church, but outside as well started tuning in. Instead of shrinking, numbers grew! As church resumed, Juan was now faced with a new issue. A space is-
